The Tribulation Period

Part 4. The Book of Revelation

Overview of the Book of Revelation

1. The book of Revelation is about the Revelation – unveiling - of **Jesus Christ at His Second Coming as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Rev 1:1-7, 19:16**. The central figure throughout the book is **the Lamb in the center of the Throne; Rev 7:17**.
2. Revelation is a book of **apocalyptic prophecy**. It consists of a series of visions given by the LORD's angel to His bond-servant John. "things which must soon take place".
3. The visions move back and forth between scenes in heaven and scenes on earth.
4. The book does not proceed in chronological order.

For example, in **Rev 6:12-14**, the 6th seal is broken. The events which occur at this time match precisely the signs that Jesus prophesied would mark His Second Coming. **Rev 6:13** is the only place in the book of Revelation that has the exact signs in the heavens that Jesus refers to in **Matt 24:29** as immediately preceding His coming. But we also find the Second Coming described in much more detail in **Rev 19:11-21**. What does that tell you about the chronology of Rev 6?

5. The book of Revelation deals with **Israel and the Gentile nations** in the run-up to the Second Coming of Christ, followed by the Judgments of Israel and the Gentile nations, the Millennial Reign of Christ, the Judgments of satan and unbelievers (Lake of Fire), and the New Jerusalem in the Eternal State.
 6. The entire book is **prophecy, Rev 1:3; 22:18-19. (discuss Rev 1:10, 19)**
 7. The entire book is addressed to the seven assemblies in Asia; **Rev 1:4; Rev 22:16.**
 8. These seven assemblies bear little or no resemblance to the body of Christ in Paul's epistles. (our work demonstrated this).
 9. The Rapture is **not** found in this book of prophecy.
 - a. Two passages in Revelation are often thought to be referring to the Rapture. They are **Rev 3:10** and **Rev 4:1-2**. *Let's read them now.*
 - b. We know that **1 Thess 4:13-18** describes the Rapture. *Let's read this passage together.* Are the events described in 1 Thess 4:13-18 also found in either Rev 3:10 or Rev 4:1-2? Let's see for ourselves.
 - c. See the **Handout "The Rapture of the Church: Comparing Revelation passages to 1Thess 4:13-18"**.
 - d. See also the **handout "Revelation 3:10 – the Greek verb *tereo*"**.
 - e. Revelation is a book of prophecy. If the body of Christ is in Revelation, the Rapture (the one church-age prophetic event) must also be in Revelation. If it isn't, then the body of Christ is not in the book of Revelation.

10. As you proceed through the seven assemblies in Rev 2-3, **the Second Coming of Christ** gets closer and closer.

Ephesus	Rev 2:5 or <u>else</u> I am coming to you and will remove your lampstand out of its place	
Smyrna	{none}	
Pergamum	Rev 2:16 or <u>else</u> I am coming to you <u>quickly</u> , and I will make war against them	
Thyatira	Rev 2:25 hold fast <u>until</u> I come.	
Sardis	Rev 3:3 Therefore <u>if</u> you do not wake up, I <u>will come like a thief</u> , and you will not know at what hour I will come to you.	
Philadelphia	Rev 3:11 ' I <u>am coming quickly</u> ;	
Laodicea	Rev 3:20 Behold, I <u>stand at the door</u> and knock;
