How secure are we? Let us count the ways. Part 10

We are doing a comprehensive study of eternal security by examining twelve ways in which our salvation is eternally secure:

- 1. Across time
- 2. How our salvation was secured
- 3. The perfection of the death of Christ (complete, all-sufficient)
- 4. Where the security of our position
- 5. Who accomplished our salvation and ensures security
- 6. What changes occurred that can never be undone
- 7. What guarantees our security
- 8. How our salvation is preserved

- 10. What God freely and permanently gave us
- 11. Why God saved us
- 12. Who God is

#1: WHEN: Our salvation has been secured across all time.

Bottom line: our salvation has been secure from all eternity past and is secure for all of eternity future.

#2: HOW: The way that we have been saved makes us secure. It cannot be reversed.

We have been saved by the death and resurrection of Christ.

We have been saved by **God's grace** *Eph 2:8-9*

We have been saved by **hearing the gospel (good news) preached**....*Eph 1:13-14 Rom 10:14-17*

.....through faith – by believing the good news about Christ.

We have been saved by God foreknowing us, predestining us, calling us, justifying us, and glorifying us.

Our salvation is **God's work** from start to finish. God's work is perfect. (see #3). We contribute nothing. No man shall boast. No created being had a hand in providing it to us. Our salvation therefore rests solely on the character of God.

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#3: The perfection of the death of Christ (complete, allsufficient)

Christ's death on the cross is the **one perfect sacrifice** for <u>all time</u> and for all of the sins of mankind.

Christ's death **completely satisfied the claims of God's righteousness against the sinful human race**.

"propitiation" refers to satisfaction, namely God's claims against the human race were satisfied by the death of Christ.

Christ **defeated the enemies of God** at the cross.

Christ **reconciled the world to God** at the cross.

#4: Where - the security of our position

At the cross: we have been placed into His death. We were crucified with Christ. We were buried with Him and raised with Him.
