Chapters 7-12 of Isaiah

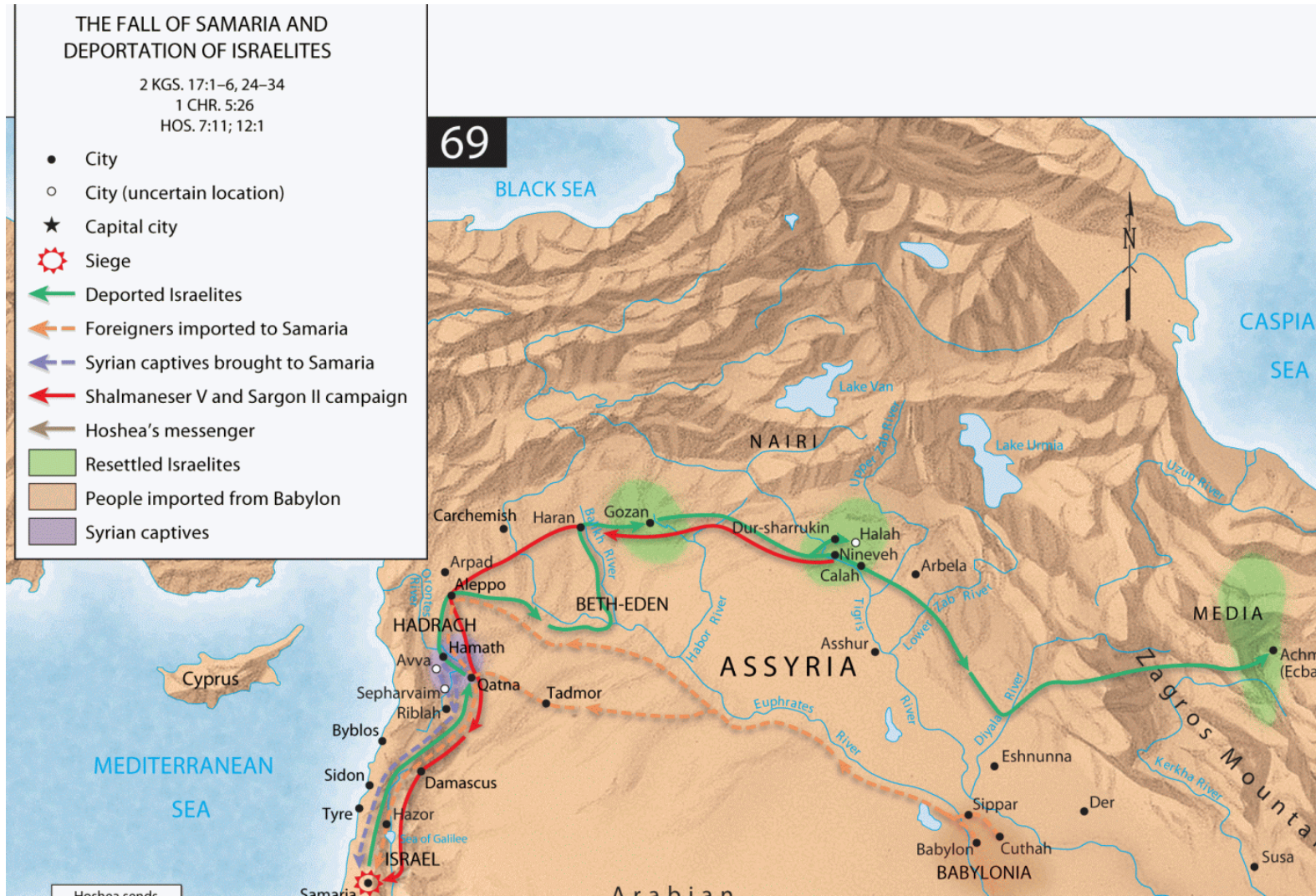
Historical events set the stage for the prophetic drama of the Messiah, our Lord Jesus Christ.

What historical events?

Readings: **Isaiah 7:1-16; 2Ki 16:1-18; 2Ch 28:5-21 (note the Philistines in verse 18)**



Readings: **Isaiah 7:17-20; 8:1-8; 2Ki 17:1-6, 24-34**



Outline of chapters 7-12

7:1-13	God's promise to deliver Judah from the alliance of Aram and Ephraim met with unbelief by Ahaz, Judah's king, who trusts human power (a treaty with Assyria) rather than God.	
7:14-15	The sign of Immanuel	
7:16-8:22	The future destruction of Aram and Israel (complete) as well as Judah (a remnant preserved) at the hands of Assyria	
9:1-7	The first and second coming of Messiah	
9:8-10:4	Judgment on Israel – the Lord's outstretched hand (as in 5:25)	
10:5-19, 23-34	Destruction of Assyria	
10:20-22	"A remnant will return"	
11:1-16	The Messiah will one day rule in Zion as King over all the nations.	
12:1-6	Song of praise to the Lord	

Readings: **Isaiah 7:1-18; 8:3-8; 9:1-12; 10:5-17; 11:1-11; 12:1-6**

These chapters contain **three significant prophecies of the Messiah and His Kingdom**

Readings: **Isaiah 7:14-15; 9:1-7; 11:1-16**

Passage	Messianic Prophecy	Fulfillment
Isa 7:14-15	His First Coming	<i>Matt 1:23</i>
Isa 9:1-7	His First and Second coming, and His Future Kingdom	<i>Matt 4:14-16; Luk 1:31-33,79; 2:11</i>
Isa 11:1-16	His Future Kingdom	<i>Matt 24:30-31;Rom 15:12</i>
