## Thursday Evening Bible Study Series: The Book of Isaiah

Teaching Summary for Week 41

## Chapters 38 and 39: ASSYRIA EXITS; BABYLON ENTERS

Chapters 36 and 37 closed out the Assyrian threat to Judah with a miraculous deliverance by the Lord. Chapters 38 and 39 focus on Hezekiah's life afterwards. It's a story of answered prayer, a foolhardy decision, and a prophesy of future ruin at the hands of the Babylonians, who will take Israel into exile. In this way, chapters 36-39 serve as the bridge between the prophecies of chapters 1-35 and those of chapters 40-66. You will find parallel accounts in 2 Kings 18-20 and 2 Chronicles 32:1-33.

The narrative in chapter 38 gets a little convoluted.

38:1-8 narrates events which occurred a little bit <u>before</u> Sennacherib's invasion of chapters 36 & 37.

38:9-20 are things Hezekiah wrote after his illness and recovery. 9-15 give his thoughts on his impending death. 16-20 record his prayer to the Lord (expanding on verse 3).

38:21-22 record events that occurred right after verse 6. See 2 Kings 20:8-11.

And 39:1 occurs after 38:1-8.

## Let's read chapters 38 and 39 now.

## **Discussion Guide**

- 1. What motivated the Lord to add years to Hezekiah's life?
- 2. What is the gist of what Hezekiah wrote in 38:9-15?
- 3. Does his writing remind you of any other writing in the Old Testament? Who or what?
- 4. Compare and contrast Hezekiah's prayer in 38:3,16-19 with his prayer in 37: 15-20.
- 5. What sign did the Lord give Hezekiah after he prayed in chapter 38? How about in chapter 37? Why? How did each sign fit its prayer? Did Hezekiah ask for a sign either time? See 2 Kings 20:8-11. Insights?
- 6. Why did the Lord allow Hezekiah to be alone with the envoys from Babylon, according to 2 Chronicles 32:31? Did Hezekiah pass the test?
- 7. Why did Hezekiah fail the test, according to 2 Chronicles 32:25-26? Show how Isaiah 39:1-4 reflects this.
- 8. What are the consequences of Hezekiah's sin?
- 9. Give a couple of other examples in the Old Testament where one man disobeyed the Lord, and that resulted in dire consequences for himself and others.
- 10. What is the most important lesson you will take away from chapters 36-39?
