Salvation – scriptures

Eternal security is defined in terms of salvation. What is Salvation?

Let's study the following scripture passages and answer the questions below:

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Mat 1:21; Luk 1:77; John 1:12; John 3:14-16, 18; Joh 3:36; Joh 5:24; Rom 3:21-26; Rom 4:3; Rom 5:8-11; Rom 6:22-23; Gal 2:16; 3:13-14, 20: 4:4-7; Eph 1:7-14; Eph 2:1-10; Heb 10:11-14.
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What are we saved **from**?

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Our sins, Mat 1:21; Rom 3:23; Rom 6:22; Eph 1:7

Judgment/condemnation, Joh 3:18; 5:24;

Death (2<sup>nd</sup>) /perishing, Joh 3:16; 5:24; Rom 6:23

Wrath of God, Joh 3:36; Rom 5:9

Curse of, bondage under the Law, Gal 3:13-14; 4:5-7

Our certificate of debt - our IOU, Col 2:13-14

Our birth in Adam, children of wrath by nature, Eph 2:1-3; Col 2:13
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What are we given freely by God in our so-great salvation?

Forgiveness of our sins, Luk 1:77; Eph 1:7. Col 2:13

The power to become children of God/ adopted as sons, Joh 1:12; Gal 4:5

Made heirs & given an inheritance, Gal 3:14; 4:7; Eph 1:11

Eternal life, Joh 3:15-16; 3:36; 5:24; Rom 6:23

Righteousness of God (faith credited as), Rom 3:22; 4:3-5

Justification (declared righteous by God), Rom 3:24,26; Gal 2:16

Redemption, Rom 3:24; Gal 3:13-14; Eph 1:7

Propitiation (God's righteousness is completely satisfied by the blood of Christ as the one perfect sacrifice for sins) Rom 3:25

Reconciliation, Rom 5:8-11

Sanctification, Rom 6:22

The indwelling Holy Spirit, Gal 3:14; 4:6

Position in Christ, Eph 1:7-13

The mystery of God's will made known to us, Eph 1:9

Sealed in Christ with the Holy Spirit as a quarantee of our inheritance, Eph 1:13

Predestined to be to the praise of God's glory, Eph 1:11-12

Made God's own possession, Eph 1:14

The surpassing riches of His grace, Eph 1:7; Eph 2:7

The surpassing greatness of His power, Eph 1:19.

Risen and Seated with God in the heavenly places in Christ, Eph 2:6

Salvation by grace through faith. Eph 2:8

Created in Christ as God's workmanship, Eph 2:10

A high calling according to God's purpose and grace, 2Ti 1:9, Rom 8:28

Use these scriptures to answer the two questions below:

Joh 3:16; Joh 5:24; Act 16:31; Rom 3:19-26;423-25; 5:6-10; 17-19; Rom 8:29-30; Gal 3:7-14; Eph 1:3-7, 13-14; Eph 2:1-9; Col 1:21-23; 2:13-14; Heb 7:23-27; 9:23-26;10:11-14; 1Pe 2:21-25; 3:18

What did we contribute to our salvation?

Nothing.

We were helpless and ungodly when God saved us. (Rom 5:6)

We were dead in our trespasses and sins when God saved us. (Eph 2:1,5; Col 2:13)

We were God's enemies when He saved us. (Rom 5:10)

We were children of wrath, walking according to the prince of the power of the air. (Eph 2:2-3

We were alienated and hostile in mind. (Col 1:21)

So God contributed everything to our salvation. It's his exclusive, perfect, and complete work. He gave it to us as His gift by His grace.

How are we saved?
