Ezra 3:1-12

Title: Back to the future

So far (chapters 1 and 2):

- Cyrus provides resources for the return to Israel
- The gave freely for the second temple
- Remember Isaiah prophesied about Cyrus

Coming up in Chapter 3:

- Cyrus gave resources for the temple
- Sacrifices back
- Cornerstone + foundation
- His mercy (lovingkindness) endures forever

Going together as <u>one man</u> to Jerusalem (Ezra 3:1) means that people were on the same page having returned to the land that the Lord gave them.

The Israelites were afraid of their neighbors (Ezra 3:3) and brought back the feasts and offerings that for a great time they neglected, being outside of their land (Ezra 3:4-6).

The people re-instituted the sacrifices the law required of them.

Deuteronomy 12:26-32

Jesus Christ is the ultimate sacrifice that bests the ones the Israelites restarted upon their return to Jerusalem.

Cyrus gave resources (Ezra 3:7). Tyre and Zidon are in present-day Lebanon, and they were wealthy places. God used their wealth to provide for His own purposes.

Many of the Israelites <u>rejoiced</u> having seen the foundation what would become the second temple (Ezra 3:10-11).

The people wept, and some rejoiced: Zechariah 4:5-10

Another prophet warned those who did not acknowledge the second temple rightly.

Haggai 2:1-9

The Israelites praised the Lord with instruments once the foundation was laid because of an ordinance from David (Ezra 3:10).

We rest on an even better foundation.

We are a temple of sorts, too, and Jesus Christ is the cornerstone.
